Monitor unfamiliar faces with surveillance cameras. Control building access with security systems. Employ guards to patrol the school perimeter



PREVENTIVE POLICY

Zero-tolerance policies punish violence appropriately and deter future incidents. Policy can also foster a safe, inclusive environment that encourages positive values



TRAIN YOUR STAFF

Nearly half of school homicide perpetrators gave at least one warning. Educate personnel on warning signs, de-escalation techniques and effective communication skills



IDENTIFY, COUNSEL

INVESTIGATE INCIDENTS RIGHT

Make sure parents, students, staff and the surrounding community know their role in reporting, addressing and preventing safety incidents in and out of school



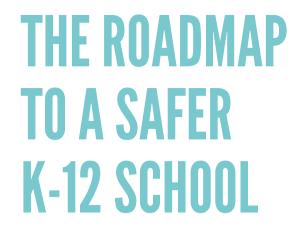
DEVELOP A PLAN
